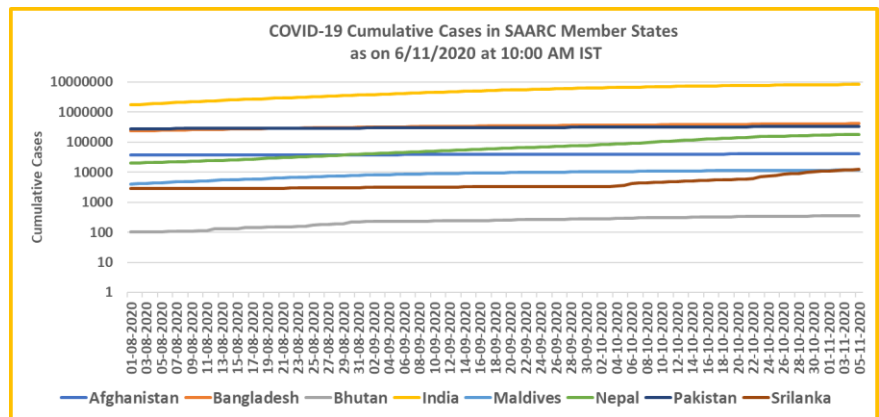
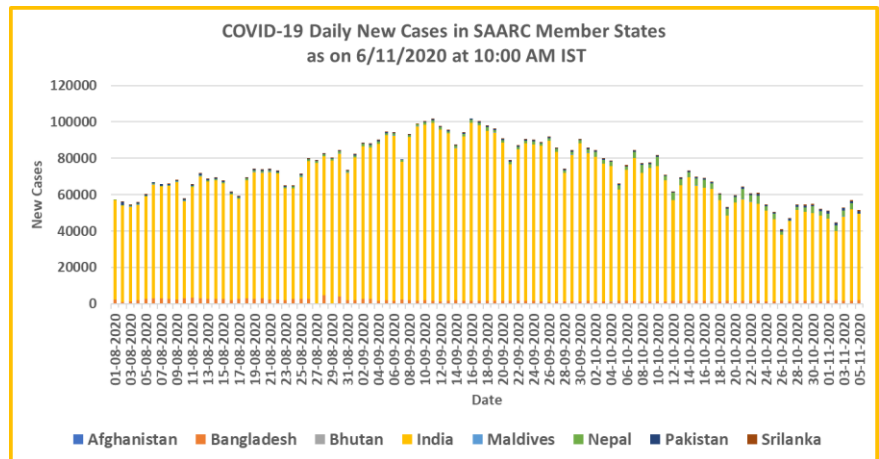

- SAARC region comprises of over 21% of the world's population which remains vulnerable towards COVID-19. The Member States have reported 94,17,660 cases, a total of 1,40,584 deaths in the region, and 86,74,024 recovered cases.

The equipment includes X-Ray machines, computed radiography systems, ICU ventilators, video endoscopy units, anesthesia machines, laboratory equipment and ambulances. Additional ventilators were also gifted to assist Nepali Army in its fight against COVID-19 pandemic. This follows an earlier army-to-army provision of ventilators in July this year.
