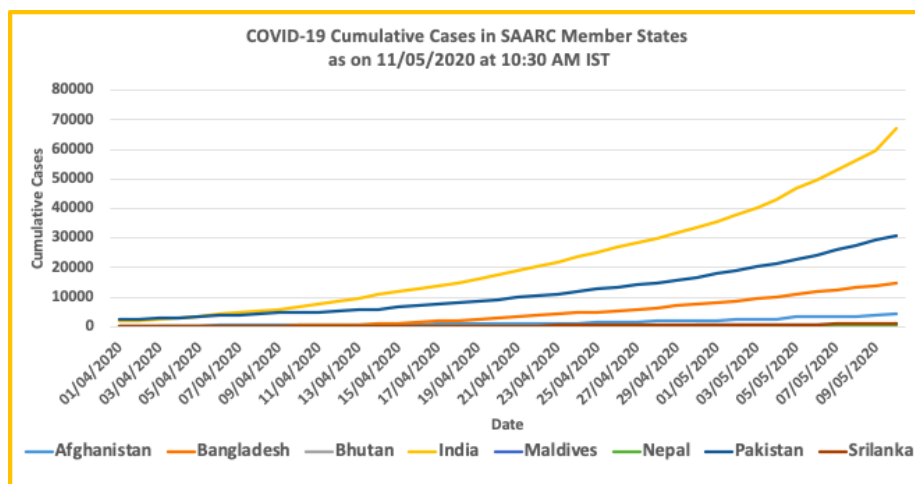
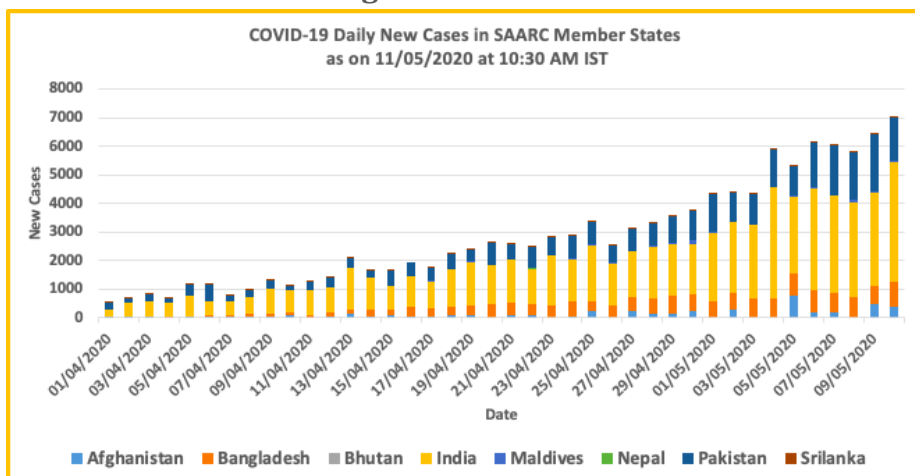

- As of 10<sup>th</sup> May 2020- 3,917,366 people have been affected by COVID-19 worldwide. About 274,361 lives have been lost. (Source: WHO)
- SAARC region comprises of over 21% of the world's population which remains vulnerable towards COVID-19. The Member States have reported 118,979 cases, a total of 3,232 deaths in the region, and 30,069 recovered cases.
- Based on the day wise data of COVID-19 cases in the SAARC Member States, time-series graphs below shows the trend of daily cases and cumulative figures:

- INS Magar, the second naval ship of the Indian Navy's Op Samudra Setu, to evacuate stranded Indian Nationals from Maldives and ensure smooth and safe passage back to India, arrived at Male Port on the morning of 10 May 20.
  - The ship will evacuate about 200 citizens while ensuring all precautions related to COVID-19. An entirely separate section of the ship with essential facilities like food and washrooms has been prepared to accommodate the evacuees and a separate mess has been allotted for ladies, infants and senior citizens. Additional precautions have been taken by dividing the evacuees into groups to avoid crowding at common areas like dining hall, bathrooms etc.
  - Concurrently, the first ship carrying evacuees from Maldives, INS Jalashwa reached Kochi harbour this morning with 698 Indian citizens. *(Source: pib.gov.in)*
